MATTER UNDER RULE 377

I wish to draw attention towards the slow progress of the Parvan River Multipurpose Project, which is a critically important project for the people of my constituency. This ambitious project involves the construction of the dam, water tunnel, and other irrigation development projects that promise significant benefits, including improved irrigation, drinking water supply, and power generation for the Jhalawar, Kota, and Baran districts. Despite the clearances, fund allocations, technological advancements and high-tech features, the project has been plagued by slow progress. The Ministry of Jal Shakti added the project to its Accelerated Irrigation Benefit Program (AIBP) but still the remaining work is progressing at a sluggish pace, which threatens to delay the project further and undermine its benefits to the region. I respectfully request that the Ministry address this matter urgently and get a status report on the project. With the new Government in the state, I urge the Ministry and the State Government to accelerate the remaining work on the Parvan River Multipurpose Project and ensure its timely completion to alleviate the water issues faced by our constituents and enhance regional development.

Shri Dushyant Singh Ji,

Kindly refer to the matter raised by you under Rule 377 on 05.08.2024 regarding expediting progress of Parvan multipurpose project.

In March, 2021, Government of India approved inclusion of the project for central assistance under Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchai Yojana-Accelerated Irrigation Benefits Programme, to ensure its early completion with augmentation of financial resources by this Ministry. Till July, 2024, physical progress reported on the project is about 77% and completed by July 2025.

Further, this Ministry takes a number of steps to ensure timely completion of centrally assisted irrigation projects. Central Water Commission monitors the physical and financial progress of the projects atleast two times a year. Further, such projects are also reviewed at Secretary level once every two months. In addition, State-wise review of the projects is also undertaken by Cabinet Secretariat about once a month.

I am hopeful that with efforts of the implementing State Government as well as this Ministry, the project shall be completed as per its scheduled target of July, 2025.
